- Born January 25, 1945
- Died October 16, 1992

- Science Teacher in Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties in Maryland
- From 1983 at Laurel High School, Laurel, Maryland

#### Herbert S. Desind

- AKA: "Mr. Cineroc" to his NAR friends
- 1985 Applicant for NASA Teacher In Space
- 1991 Outstanding Science Teacher of the Year, Prince Georges County and PEPCO
- 1992 Diagnosed with colon cancer died later that year

#### Herbert S. Desind

- 1993 Laurel High School institutes
   H. S. Desind Memorial Scholarship for student pursuing space studies
- 1994 Herbert S. Desind Memorial Space Awareness Center opens at Laurel High
- 1996 Desind Collection donated to NASM

- Composed of air and space subject matter
- B&W, Color and Transparent materials
- Few documents, most papers are correspondence related to the numerous requests for photos
- Photos gained from NASA, DoD and manufacturers and sub-contractors world-wide

- Currently housed at NASM-UHC
- 101 cubic feet of material
- Images have been sorted by subject then by type of photograph
   (B&W separated from color images)
- Collection arranged very closely to NASM Archives Technical Files arrangement

- The aircraft photographs cover the 1960s to the early 1990s
- The space photographs cover World War Two to the present
- Collection is Worldwide in scope
- Likely to be 130,000 plus images
- Manual selection no videodisc or CD at the current time

- Covers 1960s to the early 1990s
- Significantly supplements holdings in the NASM Archives Technical files downtown
- Collection is Worldwide in scope
- Hardest portion to process
  - Desind did not appear to be as enthusiastic about aviation as he did for space

 Experimental aircraft or "newsworthy" types that Desind was aware of were often the subject of a request for photos


